Though not known to be grown anywhere in France today, it is grown in California and Australia. "Petite" hardly describes its character. The grape produces a wine dark in color (blue-red hues) with great extraction and big tannins that will reward those with the patience to cellar. Even younger wines, however, will benefit from decanting. 2009 Treana White

Treana White is inspired by the great white wines of France's Rhône region. A blend of Viognier (the star of the northern Rhône) and Marsanne (the workhorse of the southern Rhône), Treana White adds an extra measure of California richness to produce a mouth-filling, age-worthy wine.

The grapes come primarily from the Santa Lucia Highlands in Monterey County, many from the notable Mer Soleil Vineyard.

The cool climate allows for an exceptionally long growing season—plenty of time for the grapes to hang on the vine and concentrate their flavors, without losing essential acidity.

The grapes are whole-cluster pressed, Champagne style, to maximize fruit flavors and minimize harsh skin influences. After two days of settling, the juice goes into French oak barrels, 20%-30% new, for fermentation; another small percentage is fermented in tank to accentuate freshness when blending time comes around.

Once fermentation is complete, the wine stays on its lees for nine months, extracting extra flavor and texture components from the spent yeast. Only a portion of the wine goes through malolactic fermentation, adding body but retaining good acidity. The resulting wine has floral aromatics, intense stone fruit flavors, overtones of honey, and a particularly lush mouthfeel. There's enough bright fruit to drink this wine right now, but enough acidity and minerality for Treana White to develop with age in the bottle—not a common trait among California white wines.

Cline Cellar

In the latter part of the 1800s, Oakley, Contra Costa County was a booming farming community with thousands of acres of orchards and healthy vineyards. Fred Cline's maternal grandfather, Valeriano Jacuzzi of pump and spa fame, called this place home. On summer visits to his grandparents, Fred learned both the love of agricultural life and the mysteries of vinifying grapes into wine. These lessons led Fred to obtain a degree in Agriculture Management from U.C. Davis. In 1982, with an inheritance from his grandfather, Fred founded Cline Cellars near Oakley, California. Here, he preserved and restored many ancient vine sites to their rightful reign as premier California wine lands.

In 1991, Fred and his wife Nancy relocated the winery from Oakley to the Carneros region of Sonoma County on a historic 350-acre estate with new vineyards and facilities. While much of the cool Carneros region is planted to Chardonnay, Pinot Noir and Merlot, Fred pioneered planting of Rhône varieties including Syrah, Viognier, Marsanne and Roussanne.

Over the years, Fred's innovation has consistently resulted in some of northern California's most distinctive Rhône-style wines and intense, flavorful Zinfandels, many with 90+ point ratings from Wine Spectator. Wine & Spirits called our Ancient Vines Mourvèdre "one of the top 100 values," and in 2011 Robert Parker Jr. wrote in the Wine Advocate, "this is the finest portfolio of value-priced wines from Cline Cellars that I have tasted to date."

2009 Syrah, Steinbeck Vineyard

This wine defines Paso Robles Syrah with enticing, opulent flavors of black cherry accented by hints of sweet vanilla oak and baking spices. Reminiscent of a true Rhône wine, Eberle Steinbeck Vineyard Syrah is beautiful in its youth, but will age gracefully over the next several years!

Io

Curiosity is one of history's great motivators. Amid speculation that the region would never amount to much for Rhône variety wines, the original vines for Io were planted in 1991 at the Nielson Vineyard, one of the region's oldest sites. Three grafted acres of Syrah, one of Mourvedre and one of Grenache provided results that were compelling enough to merit a Syrah clonal trial in 1995. Once again the results spoke volumes about the potential for Rhône varieties in the region, prompting the winery to begin sourcing Syrah from a select handful of the region's best vineyard designates.

Since 1996, we have produced dense, striking Syrahs from a handful of mid-Californian coastal and inland sites. Our home is Santa Barbara County's famed Santa Maria Bench. It is a place of brisk winds, thick fog and cool temperatures. It is one of the world's great environments for Syrah and its Rhône cousins.

The Name

Io is named after the mythological Argive princess who was also the daughter of an ancient river god. According to the myth, Zeus saw the beautiful maiden by the banks of the Inachus River. Overcome by desire for her, he shrouded the earth in a dark cloud to secretly meet with her and hide his exploits from his jealous wife Hera. Io's descendent, Hercules, plays a major role in Greek mythology. Io is an apt name for the wine that draws its fruit from the beautiful mist-shrouded valleys of the Central Coast to create a rich, sensuous wine.

Valley / climate

The 12-mile long Santa Maria Valley is located on an unusual topographical slice of land known as a transverse range. Unlike the majority of California's wine-producing valleys, the orientation is east to west rather than north to south. The unobstructed gateway to the Pacific Ocean delivers a daily dose of marine air into the vineyards.

Most mornings the vineyards are covered in thick billows of fog. The afternoon winds regularly kick in around 1:30 pm and stay until nightfall. The combined efforts of the two elements benefit the vines by restricting photosynthesis, cooling the fruit and mitigating mold and botrytis pressure on the bunches.

Our estate vineyards on the Santa Maria Bench are considered Region I on the U.C. Davis scale (one being the coldest and five being the warmest) experiencing a daily annual temperature average of 74 degrees. With only 12 to 20 inches of rain a year, irrigation is a necessity especially for young vines. Typically the vineyard sees budbreak in February, veraison in June/July and harvest in October, making it one of the longest growing seasons in California.

Nielson Vineyard

No other vineyard in Santa Barbara County offers the vine age and world-class character of the Nielson Vineyard, Santa Barbara County's commercial vineyard planted in 1964. Located on the Santa Maria Bench in the foothills of the Tepusquet Mountain Range, the elevation of Nielson Estate vineyard is 500 to 750 feet in elevation. The slope is approximately 15-20%. The vineyard features vines planted to the esteemed Estrella clonal selection of Syrah, some of which exceed 25 years of age. Ranked a Climatic Region I (the coolest of the five grape

Davis scale), the Nielson Vineyard enjoys one of the longest, coolest growing seasons in California. Average summertime high temperature is a modest 75 degrees. Fruit from this cool vineyard contributes concentration, richness, and dark fruit qualities to it, reminiscent of wines from the Northern Rhône Valley.

Upper Bench

The Upper Bench Vineyard (Nielson and Tepusquet) is located in eastern Santa Maria Valley at the foothills of the San Rafael Mountains. Coastal influences from the nearby Pacific Ocean keep temperatures moderately cool, help lengthen the growing season and promote slow, even ripening of the grapes. Climatic conditions are considered a warm Region I to a cool Region II on the U.C. Davis scale. Clones in the vineyard include the Durrell selection, which is known for complexity and richness, and Clone 01 of the Australian series, recognized for its forward fruit character.

Ryan Road Vineyard

Ryan Road Vineyard is located in northern San Luis Obispo County, east of the town of Atascadero. This certified organic vineyard was planted in 1998 using the Estrella clone and UCD Shiraz 06, the site consists of shallow, calcareous soils. Irrigation is carefully regulated with soil monitors, allowing only enough water for the vines to survive. The vineyard experiences warm days and cool nights and is considered a Region III on the UC Davis scale. These factors-shallow soil, irrigation control and warm climate-combine to produce very low vigor vines with small leaves and short shoots of only 30 to 35 inches in length. The berry size is less than one half the size of normal Syrah, which gives the wine rich expression and superb concentration

White Hawk Vineyard

The White Hawk Vineyard is located in the Los Alamos Valley in Santa Barbara County. This area is quickly becoming well known for its superb vineyards. This Region II site was planted to Syrah clones 1 and 6, and is comprised of ancient sand dunes situated on the south-facing slope of Cat Canyon. The "Arnold Sand" series found here, which was developed over soft sandstone, has highly efficient draining properties. The vineyard is 21 miles west of the Pacific and is planted at 900 feet elevation with 15 - 45% slopes. The oft-present fog influe typically burns off by mid-morning. Farmed with sustainable (including integrated pest management) and primarily organic practices, the vineyard produces low-yielding vines (typically around 2.5 tons per acre). The small, dark berries have a strong core of acidity complemented by black fruit and gamey elements.

Santa Maria gets in your blood. Jonathan Nagy can attest to that. His first 13 years were spent in Santa Maria before moving to San Jose. In 1997, he attended the University of California, Davis, where he earned his Bachelor of Science in chemistry. Following graduation, Nagy returned to Santa Maria Valley where he began working at Cambria Winery and with his knowledge was quickly promoted to lab director in 1998. The following year he was promoted to enologist.

The Winemaker - Jonathan Nagy

In March 2001, Jonathan joined Byron Vineyards & Winery as assistant winemaker, where he trained with winery founder Ken Brown and promoted by Ken to his current role in the spring of 2003. According to Ken, "Jonathan has a great wine knowledge and savvy instincts. At only 31 years of age, he has one of the best palates I've ever tasted with and I am confident that he will continue to produce world-class wines."

Describing Santa Maria Valley as one of California's top regions for growing Rhône varietals, Nagy devotes a great deal of time exploring and understanding the interplay between the vineyards and winemaking practices. "I've learned that paying attention to every detail makes a big difference," he says. His experimental work with Australian and French winemaking methods has helped to shape his winemaking style, one that is adventurous while still being rooted in classical Burgundian production methods.

Jonathan lives in Santa Maria with his wife, Clarissa, who is also in the wine industry. He likes playing basketball and coaches a local high school basketball team. He's also passionate about the outdoors and he and his wife enjoy hiking and exploring California's rugged Central Coast region.

Cuvée Doucinello:

Cette cuvée porte le nom, chaque année, d'une des trois filles du vigneron : Floureto, Doucinello et Azalaïs.

Elle est constituée selon l'encépagement type du domaine :

- 70% de grenache
- 20% de syrah
- 7% de mourvèdre
- 3% de cinsault

Son élevage est d'un minimum de 6 mois dans les foudres avant la mise en bouteille.

Cette cuvée représente 80% de la production, soit environ 45 à 50 000 bouteilles.

Cuvee Lopy:

Lopy, nom venant de la ferme où est né le vigneron, est issue de la sélection des vieilles vignes de grenache de plus de 65 ans et d'une parcelle de syrah de 40 ans.

- 75% de grenache
- 25% de syrah

Son élevage est d'environ de 12 à 15 mois dans des tonneaux de 450 l de 2 à 3 vins.

La cuvée de Lopy représente selon les années entre 8 et 10 000 bouteilles.
